

MOBILE PHONES – STUDENT USE



Help for non-English speakers.

The Department covers the costs of a range of interpreting and translation services to support schools to communicate key information to parents with limited or no English language skills about their child's education. Schools must follow the Department's policy and guidance on using these services: [Interpreting and Translation Services](#). Translation of school policies are not covered by the Department funded service because they fall outside of the categories of work which are supported, as set out in the guidance chapter [Translation assignments](#). However, schools can consider the Department funded service for support in interpreting the information in this policy in a meeting or telephone call between the parent/carer and school. While it is not mandatory to include the below section on 'Help for non-English speakers' in this policy, it is important to ensure all families are aware of interpreting and translation services available to them through the school.

PURPOSE

To explain to our school community the Department's and Knox Park Primary School policy requirements and expectations relating to students using mobile phones and other personal mobile devices during school hours.

SCOPE

This policy applies to:

1. All students at Knox Park Primary School
2. Students' personal mobile phones brought onto the school premises during school hours, including recess and lunchtime.

DEFINITIONS

For the purpose of this policy, "**mobile phone**" refers to mobile phones and any device that may connect to or have a similar functionality to a mobile phone.

POLICY

Knox Park Primary School understands that students may bring a personal mobile phone to school, particularly if they are travelling independently to and from school.

At Knox Park Primary School

- Students who choose to bring mobile phones to school must have them switched off and securely stored during school hours.
- Exceptions to this policy may be applied if certain conditions are met (see below for further information)
- When emergencies occur, parents or carers should reach their child by calling the school's office.

Personal mobile phone use

In accordance with the Department's [Mobile Phones — Student Use Policy](#) issued by the Minister for Education, personal mobile phones must not be used at Knox Park Primary School during school hours, including lunchtime and recess, unless an exception has been granted.

Where a student has been granted an exception, the student must use their mobile phone for the purpose for which the exception was granted, and in a safe, ethical, and responsible manner.

Secure storage

Mobile phones owned by students at Knox Park Primary School are considered valuable items and are brought to school at the owner's (student's or parent/carer's) risk. Students are encouraged not to bring a mobile phone to school unless there is a compelling reason to do so. Please note that Knox Park Primary School does not have accident insurance for accidental property damage or theft. Students and their parents/carers are encouraged to obtain appropriate insurance for valuable items. Refer to the Knox Park Primary School's Personal Property Policy AND/OR the Department's [Claims for Property Damage and Medical Expenses policy](#).

Where students bring a mobile phone to school, Knox Park Primary School will provide secure storage. Secure storage is storage that cannot be readily accessed by those without permission to do so. At Knox Park Primary School students are required to hand their phones to the office on arrival at school and collect them at the end of school time.

Enforcement

Students who use their personal mobile phones inappropriately at Knox Park Primary School may be issued with consequences consistent with our school's existing student engagement policies *e.g. Student Wellbeing and Engagement and/or Code of Conduct or Bullying policies.*

At Knox Park Primary School inappropriate use of mobile phones is **any use during school hours**, unless an exception has been granted, and particularly use of a mobile phone in the following instances:

- in any way that disrupts the learning of others
- to send inappropriate, harassing, or threatening messages or phone calls
- to engage in inappropriate social media use including cyber bullying
- to capture video or images of people, including students, teachers, and members of the school community without their permission
- to capture video or images in the school toilets, changing rooms, swimming pools and gyms
- during class and assessments

Exceptions

Exceptions to the policy:

- may be applied during school hours if certain conditions are met, specifically,
 - Health and wellbeing-related exceptions; and
 - Exceptions related to managing risk when students are offsite.
- can be granted by the Principal, or by the teacher for that class, in accordance with the Department's [Mobile Phones — Student Use Policy](#).

The three categories of exceptions allowed under the Department's [Mobile Phones — Student Use Policy](#) are:

1. Learning-related exceptions

Specific exception	Documentation
For specific learning activities (class-based exception)	Unit of work, learning sequence
For students for whom a reasonable adjustment to a learning program is needed because of a disability or learning difficulty	Individual Learning Plan, Individual Education Plan

2. Health and wellbeing-related exceptions

Specific exception	Documentation
Students with a health condition	Student Health Support Plan
Students who are Young Carers	A localised student record

3. Exceptions related to managing risk when students are offsite

Specific exception	Documentation
Travelling to and from excursions	Risk assessment planning documentation
Students on excursions and camps	Risk assessment planning documentation
When students are offsite (not on school grounds) and unsupervised with parental permission	Risk assessment planning documentation
Students with a dual enrolment or who need to undertake intercampus travel	Risk assessment planning documentation

Where an exception is granted, the student can only use the mobile phone for the purpose for which it was granted.

Camps, excursions, and extracurricular activities

Knox Park Primary School will provide students and their parents and carers with information about items that can or cannot be brought to camps, excursions, special activities and events, including personal mobile phones.

Exclusions

This policy does not apply to

- Out-of-School-Hours Care (OSHC)
- Out-of-school-hours events
- Travelling to and from school
- iPads and all other personal devices

COMMUNICATION

This policy will be communicated to our school community in the following ways:

- Available publicly on our school's website (or insert other online parent/carer/student communication method)
- Included in staff induction processes and staff training.
- A reminder Included in school newsletter.
- Included in staff handbook/manual.
- Discussed at annual staff briefings/meetings.
- Included in transition and enrolment packs.
- Discussed at parent information nights/sessions.
- Hard copy available from school administration upon request.
